

EXTENSION EDUCATION

5.1 Directorate of Extension Education

The Directorate of Extension Education has been established according to the Chapter-3 Part-IX vide Section 14-1(3) of the Gujarat Agricultural Universities Act-2004, for dissemination of the findings of research and technical information through extension education programmes. The main function of the Directorate is to plan, coordinate, organize and guide the extension education programmes in the university and to ensure efficient working of the extension activities in close coordination with other development departments and state voluntary organizations, other officers and scientists of the university. Dr. D. B. Kuchhadiya was incharge Director of Extension Education. He supervised and guided the extension education activities.

5.2 Extension Education Council

The Extension Education Council has been constituted according to the provision of the Gujarat Agricultural Universities Act-2004 in exercise of the power vested under Sec. No. 62(1) in pursuance of section 17(5).

5.3 Extension Education and Training Programmes

(I) Diploma/Certificate Courses for Farm Youths

The Junagadh Agricultural University has conducted various diploma/ certificate courses during the year under report as per the details given in Table 5.1.

All these courses are aiming to impart skill oriented practical training for farmer's son/daughter in order to provide an opportunity for self-employment and employment in different organizations. There is a provision of monthly stipend in all the courses.

(II) Training Programmes for Extension Workers

(a) Training and Visit System

The Junagadh Agricultural University has taken up the task of training for the extension personnel of the Department of Agriculture and Horticulture through the Training & Visit System. The details about number of bimonthly workshops, preseasonal training workshops and short term training programmes organized for the extension personnel of the Department of Agriculture and number of SMSs/AEOs attended the programmes are as under.

(b) Centre of Excellence for Training (Oilseeds)

The centre has continued to provide better training to the extension personnel to improve their technical competency in the area of oilseeds production. This centre organizes the national workshop-cum-seminar on oilseeds production technology. The centre also plans the training programmes for the Master trainers and SMSs.

(c) State Level Training Programmes Sponsored by Central Government and Other Agencies

Two state level training programmes of 3 days were organized at respective main crop research station on cotton and sugarcane under the project of Central Sector Scheme, State level training programmes, wherein 55 extension workers participated.

(III) Training/Extension Education Programmes for Farmers/Farm Women

(a) Training Programmes

Training is essential to increase the efficiency of the farmers, farm women, rural youths etc. Oncampus as well as off-campus training programmes are being organized based on the needs and interests of the farming community.



Through the Transfer of Technology (TOT) centres, 35 on-campus and 38 off- campus training programmes were organized, wherein 2922 participants received training. The details are depicted in Table-5.2

(b) Extension Activities

The TOT centres have also planned and organized extension activities like seminar/ workshop/symposium, field/farmer's day, agriculture fair/ exhibition, film/slide/video show, field visit, cattle camp, farmers group/demonstration meeting etc. by which totally 1,12,567 beneficiaries benefitted. The details of the extension activities organized and number of participants are given in Table-5.3.

KVKs play an important role to provide an opportunity for income generation to the farmers by imparting skill oriented trainings. Besides, the KVKs conduct variety of extension activities, on farm testing etc.

The KVKs are also collecting feed back on farmers problems, which are sent to the concerned scientists and these feed back provides guideline in reforming further research.

(c) Frontline Demonstrations

The frontline demon-stration aims to demon-strate the production potentialities of newly released and pre-released varieties and production technologies of pulses and oilseeds on farmer's fields.

In all, 351 FLDs were conducted on various oilseed and pulse crops *viz.*, castor, mustard, groundnut, gram, wheat, pearl millet and cumin in 155.80 ha during *kharif* and *rabi* seasons through KVKs. The results are appended in Table-5.4.

Feedbacks received though implementation of the front line demonstrations are as under:

- Need for effective control measure for Sclerotium rot fungi in groundnut.
- Effective measure for control of boll worm of cotton crop.
- 3) Control of blight and wilt in cumin.
- 4) To develop drought resistant varieties of various crops.
- 5) Control measures for varieties susceptible to insect-pest & disease.
- 6) Remedies for seed damages d u r i n g s e e d preparation.
- 7) There is a need of aphids resistant variety in mustard.

(d) Farm Advisory Service Scheme

The scheme has been continued at SSK, Junagadh with a view to provide guidance and the latest information to the farmers on scientific farming. The farmers are advised regarding their farm problems through correspondence and field visit. This centre acts as a link among research scientist, extension workers and farmers.

5.4 Radio Talk and T.V. programme
