# From Vice Chancellor's Desk

### Atmanirbharta in edible oil production

Dear Colleagues,

It is extremely riveting to greet you all through this new edition of the JAU Newsletter when the South West monsoon has just started to gather its full steam. Though the onset of monsoon is late, its importance can very well be judged from the words of our erstwhile Hon'ble President Dr. Pranab Mukherjee who attributed the monsoon as the 'Real Finance Minister of India' in a parliamentary session. With the monsoon having finally arrived, farmers in the Saurashtra region, Gujarat have taken up the sowing of two prime crops *viz.* groundnut and cotton and other *Kharif* crops of the region.



Undoubtedly, groundnut is the major oilseed crop in the country and it has played a vital role in the success of many oilseed promotion programmmes since the start of the Technology Mission on Oilseeds in 1986. In fact, Gujarat happens to be the pioneering state in taking up the cudgels of the 'Yellow Revolution' forward through the Amul-like cooperative model in the procurement and marketing of oilseeds. As a result, India attained self-sufficiency in edible oil production and emerged as a net oil exporter till the mid-1990s and only to falter later on.

Nobody can deny the fact that with the domestic production of almost 98% of its edible oil requirements way back in 1990-91, India was *atmanirbhar* in edible oil production. The role of Dr. Verghese Kurien through his cooperative campaign for small-scale edible oil producers called 'Operation Golden Flow' and the launch of the edible oil brand, 'Dhara', are veritable success stories in the nation's oilseed scenario. The scenario has now turned upside down. Gone are the days of self-reliance in edible oil production with India becoming the world's largest importer of edible oil importing 12-15 million tonnes (mt) of it every year costing the exchequer nothing less than ₹80,000 crores. With the average domestic production of only 11.5 mt, almost 55 to 60% of the domestic consumption of 25 mt of edible oil is bound to get imported. Despite India being the world's largest producer of oilseeds, with an area of 30 mha and a production of 40 mt, our unfathomable dependence on oil imports continues unabated.

JAU is always at the forefront in the service of the nation with the launch of many new oilseed varieties with higher oil content and improved technologies and technical practices for the welfare of the farming community. The Main Oilseed Research Station, JAU, Junagadh has recently released three groundnut varieties. Among which, the two Spanish bunch groundnut varieties *viz*. Gujarat Groundnut 37 [GG 37: Sorath Gaurav] and Gujarat Groundnut 38 [GG 38: SorathNavin] are recommended for summer and *Kharif* seasons, respectively. These varieties recorded high kernel and oil yields and have shown better resistance to pest and diseases. Besides, our Spanish bunch high oleic groundnut variety, Gujarat Groundnut 39 (GG 39: SorathUttam), recommended for *Kharif* seasonrecorded higher kernel yield, oil yield and oleic acid (>79 %). The Agricultural Research Station (ARS), Amreli has released the nation's first black seeded sesame variety, GT 11, for summer season and it has been recommended for eight states across the country. In addition, ARS, Amreli has also released Gujarat Soybean 4 (G.Soy 4: SorathSonali) variety for *Kharif* season with higher yield, oil content as well resistance to key pest and diseases. The University also maintains about 2500 germplasm lines of groundnut, 500 lines of castor, more than 4000 lines of sesame and 630 lines of soybean. The segregation of the oilseedsis also carried out every year in large numbers. The hybridization of sesame is also in the offing at ARS, Amreli.

Given this challenging scenario, I take this opportunity to urge that it is utmost necessary for us to accelerate our technological measures and policy deliverables to increase the country's oilseed production to 55 mt by 2025-26 in an effort to keep our edible oil imports below 10 mt per year.

# Visit of Peer Review Team (PRT) for ICAR Accreditation

The Peer Review Team (PRT) of NAEAB, ICAR, New Delhi paid a visit to JAU during 18-24 April, 2022 for the accreditation of the University and its constituent colleges in accordance with the selfstudy reports (SSRs) submitted by the University for the assessment period of 2016-2020. The PRT evaluated the SSRs of the University, 5 UG programmes in five colleges and 13 PG programmes in Agriculture, 4 PG programmes each in Horticulture and Agriculture Engineering & Technology and 1 PG programme in Agri-Business Management for accreditation. Dr. Shankar B. Dandin, Former VC, UAS, Bagalkot was the Chairperson of the PRT with three members and one member secretary. Dr. M. A. Shankar, Former DR. UAS, Bangaluru, Dr. Ravindra Kumar Sohane, DEE, BAU, Sabour and Dr. P. P. Dabral, Dean, CAEPHT, Sikkim served as PRT members while Dr. K. M. Manjaiah, Principal Scientist, IARI, New Delhi facilitated as the Member Secretary.



The visiting team was welcomed by Prof. (Dr.) N. K. Gontia, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, JAU and other university officers on 19<sup>th</sup> April, 2022. The members reviewed the presentations on the SSRs.




The team also visited all the colleges, concerned departments, teaching facilities, library, sports facilities, hostel facilities, research activities and extension activities carried out by JAU.



Besides, the PRT members reviewed the online exam management system, various online administration system, IT Cell and AGRESNET studio and commended the activities and efforts of the university in teaching, research, and extension.

# New Variety Released Gujarat Groundnut 39 (GG 39: Sorath Uttam)

Main Oilseeds Research Station, JAU, Junagadh released the Spanish bunch high oleic groundnut variety Gujarat Groundnut 39 (GG 39: Sorath Uttam). This variety has recorded mean pod yield of 2619 kg/ha, which was 34.43, 11.74 and 2.24 % higher than the check varieties, GJG 9 (1949 kg/ha), TG 37A (2248 kg/ha) and GJG 32 (2489 kg/ha), respectively. This variety has also recorded higher kernel yield, oil yield and oleic acid (>79%) than the check varieties. Stem rot disease was lower in GG 39, while tikka, rust and collar rot diseases were comparable to the check varieties. The infestation due to leaf defoliators was found to be lower than the check varieties.



# University Rankings

It is a matter of great pride for Junagadh Agricultural University fraternity to witness the university clinching another milestone with the conferment of an overall 7<sup>th</sup> rank (Total score: 998) among Government Agricultural Universities in India and 2<sup>nd</sup> rank in Gujarat in the Education World India Higher Education Rankings 2022-23. The selection was based on nine competitive parameters including education excellence – curriculum & pedagogy (digital readiness), faculty competence, research & innovation, placement and industry interface. Prof. (Dr.) N. K. Gontia, Hon'ble VC received the award on 28<sup>th</sup> May 2022 in the ceremony held at Gurgaon.

# **SEEG National Seminar 2022**

A two day National Seminar on 'Synergetic Extension Approaches for Livelihood Improvement and Agricultural Development' was organized by Junagadh Agricultural University, Junagadh in association with the Society of Extension Education Gujarat (SEEG) during 24-25 June 2022. The inauguration of the seminar was presided by Prof. (Dr.) Narendra Kumar Gontia, Hon'ble VC, JAU while Dr. K.B. Kathiria, Hon'ble VC, AAU, Dr. Z. P. Patel, Hon'ble VC, NAU and Dr. C. S. Praharaj, Director, ICAR-DGR, Junagadh graced the occasion as the Guests of Honour in presence of all University Officers including Dr. D. R. Mehta, DR, Dr. H. M. Gajipara, DEE and Principal and Deans, HoDs, faculty members, technical staff, sponsorers and the participants.

The souvenir of the seminar comprising the lead papers, abstracts and farmers' success stories was launched by the dignitaries along with the latest issue of the society, Gujarat Journal of Extension Education (NAAS rating: 4.96) and a booklet on 'SEEG Activities and Achievements'.



The seminar was organized across six themes and attracted altogether 626 submissions comprising 591 abstracts, 23 invited lead papers, and a dozen success stories on farm innovations. More than 300 faculties and students participated from all the four SAUs and Kamdhenu University in Gujarat and across the country from the states of Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Telangana, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and the union territories of Andaman and Nicobar and New Delhi.

Besides, fifteen selected innovative farmers from all over Gujarat were also felicitated with a certificate of appreciation during the event. # International Training for Students under NAHEP-IDP

Prof. (Dr.) N. K. Gontia, VC, JAU, Dr. D. R. Mehta, DR and PI (IDP), Dr. S. G. Savalia, Principal & Dean and Co-PI (IDP), CoA, JAU, Junagadh and all the university officers and HoDs remained present and appreciated the students on their excellent presentations.

# First reportage of Mantis shrimps from west coast of India and Gujarat Coast

During intensive survey of marine fauna along Gujarat coast, the Survey Team of Fisheries Research Station, JAU, Sikka has recorded *Carinosquilla multicarinata* (White, 1848) which was recorded for the first time from the west coast of India. While *Cloridina ichneumon* (Fabricius, 1798) was recorded for the first time from Gujarat coast, *Gonodactylellus demanii* (Henderson, 1893) was reported after 50 years from Gulf of Kachchh,

Gujarat. All the shrimps have been recorded from the Gulf of Kachchh, Gujarat. With these new records, the Mantis shrimp species diversity in Gujarat coast is summed up to nine species. The finding was published in the reputed peer reviewed taxonomic journal "Journal Threatened Taxa" in May 2022.



#### **State Level Technical Programme**

The State Level Technical Programme Meeting for Cotton *Kharif* 2022 was held at Cotton Research Station, JAU, Junagadh on 26<sup>th</sup> April 2022. Scientists and technical staffs working on cotton crop of JAU, NAU, SDAU and AAU participated in good numbers. The meeting was inaugurated by Prof. (Dr.) N. K. Gontia, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, JAU, Junagadh while Dr. D. R. Mehta, Director of Research JAU, Dr. M. C. Patel, Research Scientist (Cotton), MCRS, NAU, Surat and Dr. G. K. Katariya, Research Scientist (Cotton), JAU, Junagadh were also present. A booklet entitled "KAPAS MA PAK SHARKSHAN" was also released by the dignitaries during the event.



### Certificate Course on Pesticide Management

A Certificate Course on Pesticide Management for Input Dealers was organized by the university from 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2022 onwards to the next twelve weeks (conducted one day in a week). During its launch, Prof. (Dr.) N. K. Gontia, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, JAU outlined the importance of the course and urged the participants to apply their learnings for the benefit of farmers. Dr. H. M. Gajipara, DEE appealed to the input dealers to advise farmers about pest management for reducing cultivation cost through judicious use of inputs on their farms. A total of 1125 input dealers were benefitted from this course conducted at JAU, campus and various other centres such as KVKs (Khapat, Jamnagar, Nana Kandhasar, Targhadia, Amreli and Morbi), Fruit Research Centre, Mahuva and Polytechnic in Agriculture, Dhari. In the inauguration programme, Dr. S. G. Savalia, Principal and Dean, CoA, JAU, Junagadh, Shri. M. M. Kasundra, Joint Director of Agriculture, GoG, and Shri. S. M. Gadhesariya, Joint Director of Agriculture, GoG remained present throughout the programme.



### **Certificate Distribution Programme**

The certificate distribution programme for the input dealers was organized by the Directorate of Extension Education on 21st May, 2022. Shri. Arjunbhai Parmar, Deputy Director of Information, GoG graced the function as the Chief Guest and praised the efforts of JAU scientists in serving all the stakeholders in agriculture. Dr. H. M. Arvindbhai Timbadiya, Secretary, AIIDA remained present. A total of 266 dealers were facilitated with certificates during the event.

# **Farmers Training Programme**

Processing & Value Addition of Agricultural Produce, Use of Plastic in Agriculture and Groundwater Recharge

The training programme was organized on 10<sup>th</sup> June, 2022 by the AICRP on PHET, AICRP on PEASEM and AICRP on IWM units of the University in collaboration with the Agakhan Rural Support Programme (AKRSP), Jamkhambhaliya for the Scheduled Caste farmers of village Bhankhokhri and surrounding areas of Jamkhambhaliya Taluka under the Scheduled Caste Sub-Plan Project (SCSP). The programme was presided by Dr. H. C. Chhodvadia, Associate Extension Educationist, DEE, JAU, Junagadh while Dr. M. N. Dabhi, HoD, PFE & Research Engineer, AICRP on PHET, Dr. G. V. Prajapati, Research Engineer, AICRP on PEASEM, Prof. P. B. Vekariya, Asst. Prof, SWE, and Mr. V. K. Jogal, Cluster Manager, AKRSP served as the dignitaries. The event saw the participation of 150 farmers and farmwomen and lectures related to food processing, value addition, and plasticulture were delivered.

The 'Arzi Hookumat' museum and photo gallery of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel at SSK were the major attractions for the visitors. In their feedback, the visitors expressed their happiness in learning a gamut of modern farming practices and appreciated the bonhomie and professional excellence displayed by the university personnel while addressing to their queries.



Visit of Input Dealers and Farmers to Food Testing Laboratory

The trainees of the 'Input Dealer Training Programme' visited the Food Testing Laboratory, Dept. of Biotechnology, JAU, Junagadh. They were acquainted with the activities and facilities. The testing parameters and their end user benefits were also apprised including current testing techniques and instruments related to pesticide residue, proximate analysis, microbial analysis, elemental profiling, aflatoxin and molecular analysis. Besides being traders, as many input dealers are also progressive farmers, discussions around organic farming, NPK consortium, nano fertilizers, export parameters, proper sampling methods for soil, water and crops were also facilitated.
